Alderman Gibson made a motion, seconded by Alderman Stone, to accept and approve the agenda for tonight's meeting. The motion passed 4-0.

<u>Old Business</u>

Water Rates:

The proposed increase in water rates was reviewed. The last rate increase occurred in 2018. After discussion, it was determined that a rate increase is necessary because the city is purchasing water from PWSD#1 of Dekalb County. Alderman Gibson suggested that a letter be mailed to citizens informing them about the rate increase. The new rate will be set during the board meeting on March 26th.

New Business

Complying with RSMo 71.948. Copies of code on file with municipal clerks and open to the public. – At least three copies of the published book shall be kept on file

in the office of the municipal clerk and kept available for inspection by the public at all reasonable business hours.

At the board meeting on March 19th, the City Clerk informed the board about state statute RSMo 71.948, which requires three copies of the city code to be available at all times. The Clerk confirmed with a Missouri Municipal League representative that this statute applies to the City. The Board decided to hold off on making three copies of each ordinance until August, in order to see if the state statute would be amended to require only one copy of each ordinance.

On March 20th, the City Clerk contacted the Missouri Municipal League for further guidance on compliance with the state statute. During this discussion, it was clarified that RSMo 71.948 only applies to cities that have their ordinances codified. Since the City of Osborn's ordinances are not codified, this statute does not apply to the city.

The City Clerk also explained that city ordinances are available to the public during business hours, and ordinances from 2010 to the present are accessible on the city website. The City always complies with the Sunshine Law.

Adjourn:

As no other business was presented, Alderman Gibson moved, second by Alderman Kull to adjourn the meeting at 6:09 P.M. Motion passed 4-0.
